Sex work is at the heart of Rosie Campbell's and Kate Brown's current research focus and specifically issues of safety, violence, policing and crimes/hate crimes in the context of the lived, diverse and intersectional experiences of sex workers.

Rosie is currently involved in sharing learning about the sex work and hate crime approach with police, sex work projects, practitioners and policy makers in other areas of the UK.

Kate's work focuses on care and control of vulnerable groups. She is currently leading an N8 policing research study reviewing the impact and effectiveness the specialist Sex Work Liaison Officer role within West Yorkshire Police.
