Background

As we learn more about COVID-19 and are better able to support people, it has become clear that many people experience long term symptoms relating to a COVID-19 infection (Long COVID). This is a challenge for healthcare. Traditionally, care pathways for long-term conditions are focused on single diseases; however, that approach is not effective at supporting people with more than one long-term condition or those with medically not yet explained symptoms. Long COVID usually presents with clusters of symptoms, which may change over time. Therefore, healthcare services have to take a broader approach to care focusing on more than one system (biological, psychological and social which together are called a biopsychosocial approach). This is called an integrated care pathway. Integrated care means more than patient-centred care which can be provided in one setting, integrated care involves the whole pathway from primary care to specialist services and rehabilitation services.

In the UK, integrated care pathways offer an opportunity to explore the benefits of an integrated approach to care for long COVID, long-term conditions and multiple long-term conditions. This Delphi study refers to the approaches for considering transferability of present long COVID integrated care pathway care models to other long-term conditions.

This study seeks to answer the broad research question: What are effective integrated care pathways for individuals with long COVID and how can they be transferred to other long-term conditions including mental health problems, multiple long-term conditions and the interface between known medical disorders and medically not yet explained symptoms as well as newly developed conditions?

This Delphi study using a biopsychosocial approach, will investigate:

- 1. (a) Key enabling elements for effective integrated care pathways for individuals with long COVID, based on user experience, and (b) Strengths of existing integrated care pathways for other long-term conditions.
- 2. Which (part of an) integrated care pathway model for long COVID can be transferred to other long-term conditions for which care pathways were not yet developed sufficiently, and how.
- 3. Variations in uptake and adherence to treatment in long COVID and long-term conditions.

The findings from this survey and interviews will be reviewed by our expert panel to create a series of statements about current care.
- 2. A second survey will check whether people with personal and professional experience of long COVID and/or long term conditions agree with the statements created from the first survey.
- 3. The level of agreement with each of the statements will help the expert panel to form a set of Key Recommendations which will be sent to healthcare commissioners and policy makers.

What is the purpose of this survey?

This is the first survey in the project and focuses on long COVID and other long term conditions such as heart problems, COPD, diabetes and mental health problems. We aim to learn about the people who provide care and those seeking support, the related healthcare services and the treatments available for long COVID and other long term conditions.

Who can complete this survey?

We are looking for adults (18 years or older) who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- someone with lived experience of long COVID
- someone with lived experience of a long term condition (such as heart problems, COPD, diabetes and mental health problems)
- a healthcare professional working with people who experience long COVID
- a healthcare professional working with people who experience a long term condition (such as heart problems, COPD, diabetes and mental health problems)

How long will this survey take to complete?

We anticipate that this survey will take most people between 5 and 15 minutes to complete. If you need to take a break while completing this survey you can do this and return to where you left.

What will happen to my responses?

Once the survey closes, all of the responses will be downloaded and stored securely in an electronic folder on the University of York server. Only researchers working on this project will have access to the survey responses. The responses will be organised to provide an overview of the information generated by this survey and this will be discussed with our expert panel. Our expert panel will review the findings of this survey and create a list of statements based on the survey information which they believe reflect the experiences of people offering and accessing support for long COVID and long term conditions.

Will you know who I am?

All survey responses are completely anonymous; non of the information you provide can be traced back to you. We will, therefore, ask for some information about you so that we can describe the range of people who complete the survey. This information will be included in the findings of this study using phrases such as "On average, people completing the survey were X years old, Y% of respondents were male."

How can I find out more information about the interviews?

At the end of this survey there will be a link to a form for people who wish to express an interest in participating in an interview for this project. Creating a link to a separate form ensures that the responses for this survey are anonymous. We will try to conduct interviews with a diverse selection of people (based on demographics, experiences of healthcare and conditions, and geographical locations) to ensure that the findings from this stage of the project are relevant to as many people as possible. Because the researchers are not able to link your responses from the survey, the expression of interest form for interviews will ask you to repeat some of the general information you have provided in this survey. We will store your information securely in an electronic file on the University of York server and use it to select people to invite for interview. Integrated care means more than patient-centred care which can be provided in one setting; integrated care involves the whole pathway from primary care to specialist services and rehabilitation services. In the UK, integrated care pathways already exist for other long-term conditions such as for example diabetes or heart disease.

This study seeks to answer the broad research question: What are effective integrated care pathways for individuals with long COVID and how can they be transferred to other long-term conditions including mental health problems, multiple long-term conditions and the interface between known medical disorders and medically not yet explained symptoms as well as newly developed conditions?

Who is doing the study?

This study is part of the STIMULATE-ICP research (https://www.stimulate-icp.org/) that is led by Prof. Ami Banerjee, University College London, and is funded by the National Institute of Health Research (NIHR), UK. The STIMULATE-ICP team involves a wide range of researchers from many disciplines, people with lived experiences (PPI) of Long COVID and long-term conditions, and clinicians from a range of health service settings. This Delphi survey has been developed with input from all groups and is the result of this collaboration. It is being led by Prof. Christina Van Der Feltz-Cornelis, Department of Health Sciences, University of York, UK as academic lead, and colleds Dr. Gail Allsopp, GP, Royal College of General Practitioners, Prof. Mark Gabbay, GP, Patient and Public involvement (PPI) leads Emily Attree, PPI and GP and Lyth Hishmeh, PPI.

What is the survey for?

In a first survey, important aspects of integrated care pathways have been identified and summarised in statements about what integrated care should look like. This second survey now provides the opportunity to indicate the level of agreement with each statement, and to rank them in terms of importance.

What will we do with your survey responses?
