<p>Assessment Guidance</p> <p>All elements must be successfully completed; failure to successfully achieve any of these elements would result in programme failure and the student would not be entered onto the professional register.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The student has met all the required Knowledge, Skills and Behaviours and the employer and the University of York are satisfied that the student has consistently demonstrated that they have met the Knowledge, Skills and Behaviours outlined within the occupational standard. <p>Using the information collated from the tracker document and marksheet the programme lead will confirm that the student has completed all programme outcomes through completion of the modules at a pass level.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Confirmation of English and Maths at Level 2 <p>The programme lead confirms using information on the tracker document that English and Maths at Level 2 has been achieved [This is a requirement of admission to the programme].</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Completion of all required modules, taking into account any recognition of prior learning (RPL), of the foundation degree approved by the Nursing and Midwifery Council in line with the requirements specified in the Nursing Associates Programme Standards (NMC 2018). <p>Using the information collated from the tracker document and marksheet the programme lead will confirm that the student has completed all programme outcomes through completion of the modules at a pass level.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> All Practice Assessment Documentation (PAD) to be completed and signed off by the practice and academic assessor. This includes completion of statutory Hours. <p>Students who are using the electronic ongoing achievement record (PebblePad) to record their Elective Practice Experience must complete this by the date and time given for submission on the assessment schedule. This information is collated on marksheet inputted by the academic assessor.</p> <p>The programme lead confirms that a minimum of 720 hours of protected learning time and 480 of external practice placement hours have been completed and are documented within the Ongoing Record of Achievement signed off by the practice assessor and academic assessor and the information is collated on the marksheet by the academic assessor.</p>			

5. Declaration of Good Health and Character

Students need to self-declare that they are a fit and proper person to enter the professional nursing register; these are submitted via the Secretary to the Fitness to Practise Committee.

Personal supervisors are required to declare that the student is of Good Health and Good Character and can be entered onto the professional register.

Following successful confirmation from the student and personal supervisor the programme Leader will confirm to the NMC that the student can be entered onto the professional register; entry to the professional register is subject to final ratification by the Board of Examiners of the award.

This element is non-reassessable and would be managed through the department's Fitness to Practise Committee; this may require a break in learning to enable students to meet this requirement.
