<p>Assessment guidance The summative assessment for this module is a 3,000 word written case study.</p> <p>The aim of this assessment is for you to demonstrate your knowledge and understanding of accountable and autonomous midwifery practice as the lead professional for the midwifery care and support of women and newborn infants through the childbearing continuum.</p> <p>You will be required to identify an experience from practice learning which demonstrates how you have either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Acted in accordance with relevant legal, regulatory, and governance requirements, policies, and ethical frameworks. • Used effective, authentic, and meaningful communication skills and strategies with women, newborn infants, partners and families, and/or colleagues. • Developed and maintained trusting, respectful, kind, and compassionate person-centred relationships with women/birthing people, their partners and families, and with colleagues. • Demonstrate your ability to always work in partnership with women/birthing people, basing care on individual women's needs, views, preferences, and decisions. <p>The written case study essay should be referenced and formatted according to departmental guidelines.</p>			
<p>Formative support Submission of either a draft plan or section of your summative essay for written feedback (500 words). Draft to be submitted via the VLE as per the assessment schedule.</p>
