### Formative Assessment

You are invited to submit an annotated bibliography of 1,000 words (maximum) relating to your summative assignment (essay).

Your annotated bibliography can include:

- Core references for your proposed summative essay assignment including notes/comments on the main arguments/issues each reference will provide.
- A proposed essay structure/headings and sub-headings with core references in each section

## **Summative Assessment**

You are required to write an essay that discusses community-based humanitarian responses. You are encouraged to draw on one or more case studies to critically analyse community-based approaches including their challenges and opportunities. Your essay should demonstrate an understanding of different values and knowledge systems at community level in responding to humanitarian situations.

Your essay should demonstrate thorough reading and engagement of the course material and the ability to scrutinise different approaches to present balanced arguments.

References should be used throughout your essay.
