Assessment Guidance

Formative Assessment

You are invited to develop a draft Proposal Plan of 500 words (maximum) relating to your summative assignment. The draft report plan could include:

- An outline of your chosen research topic and rationale.
- A draft section(s) of your research proposal with specific questions relating to areas of your proposal where you require specific feedback.
- A proposal plan outlining the proposed structure and some core components of each section.

Summative Assessment

You are required to write a Research Proposal. Your proposal should include:

- A brief but critical literature review
- A clear research question(s)
- Methodology and methods: providing detail of your overall approach e.g. qualitative, quantitative, mixedmethods
- Ethical consideration: discussing any ethical challenges and issues and how these will be managed
- Policy implications: the potential policy implications for the research

Your research proposal should demonstrate the ability to articulate an existing knowledge gap or clear research need and the ability to select appropriate and effective methods to conduct the necessary research.

Your proposal should be supported by references throughout.

NOTE: You do not actually conduct the research.
